# District 13 ... A Journey Through Time

Mystery #1 ... ongoing ...



The Olde School Bell, like the one on the left, was inscribed 'District 13 Superannuated Teachers of Ontario' and used to call District 13 meetings to order. It was purchased by Colin Crozier. A new bell was purchased in 1989 by Chuck Forbeck because no

one knew what happened to the original bell. We are continuing to search for both bells. Although there is no reward offered, there will be no questions asked if a bell appears at a luncheon.

#### Mystery #2 ... partly solved ...

In 1993, two million dollars in pension funds was owed to teachers who could not be located. Jackie Carson worked hard to contact retired teachers who contributed money to the pension fund and left teaching without collecting that money. She successfully located many of those teachers in our area and fifty former teachers had a windfall!

The information shared here about our history is from a book compiled by **Helen Szydlowski** entitled "The First Forty Years 1972-2012 Retired Teachers of Ontario District 13 Hamilton, Wentworth, Haldimand" Thank you, Helen!

# RTOERO & District 13 – We Begin ...

 $1917\,$  – Pensions for Ontario teachers officially began with 2% deducted from each pay cheque

**1944** – The Ontario Teachers' Federation formed

**1945** – Act name changed to the Teachers' Superannuation Act (full pension after 40 years of service)

**1954** – Pensions were based on the ten years' salary previous to retirement and varied from \$600 to \$5000 for the same length of service

**1956** – The Ontario Association of Superannuated Women Teachers (now the Retired Women Teachers of Ontario) was inaugurated and plans began for the improvement of the lower pensions given to women teachers

**1966** – All retired teachers were officially represented by The Superannuated Teachers of Ontario (STO) and this new organization (later RTOERO) was officially recognized by the Ontario Government

**1968** – STO membership was \$2.00 annually for those with pensions up to \$3,999 and \$3.00 for those with pensions above **March 14, 1968** – First meeting of STO Executive in Toronto

**1968-1969** – STO met with Minister of Education Bill Davis to discuss increasing teacher pensions

**1969** – Health service began with an agreement between STO, the Superannuation Commission and Co-Operative Health Services

**1971 –** Pension Plan improvements

- Pensions increased for 7,400 teachers who retired before 1970
- Retirees from 1950 or earlier had pensions increased 50%
- Increases ranged from 49% for 1951 retirees to 2% for 1969 retirees
- Widowers of pensioners were eligible for pensions (previously, only widows)
- 90 factor was introduced

**November 8, 1972** – At a meeting at the Hamilton Board of Education Centre, the Provincial STO formally endorsed Hamilton, Wentworth, Haldimand as a District

**1973** - When there were only 12 districts, we were number 6. By April there were 21 districts and we became District 13

# Us Staying Active! ...

- **1974** –Tours started and an STO13 newsletter created
- 1975 -STO had 25 districts and workshops for retirees began
- 1976 –Visitation Committee formed changed to Goodwill in 1979 – then Personal Concerns in 1980 and back to Goodwill in 2000
- 1980 –Membership Committee and first Golf Tournament
- 1982 Archives Committee formed
- **1982** –Project Overseas (assistance for teachers in developing countries) in 1998 became Project Service to Others with a focus on supporting local communities in 2021 renamed Community Grants and Scholarships
- **1968-1988** 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Provincial Newsletter. With the exception of the first seven years, it was edited by a succession of three District 13 members, Alan Meiklejohn, Tom McGuffin and Bill Moore
- **1992** –STO changed to Retired Teachers of Ontario (officially on July 1, 1998) with 42 Districts; D13 Citizenship Court
- **1993** –Pension Concerns (discontinued in 2015); Social Issues (Political Action in 1996 and then Political Advocacy in 2010); Finance Committee
- **1993** First Curling Bonspiel
- 1997 –District membership fees were discontinued
- 2003 –District Website created
- 2008 –District waiver form initiated, 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of RTOERO
- **2011** –RTOERO Foundation was established to support geriatric care
- **2017** –RTOERO partnered with other groups to create the political advocacy website vibrantvoices.ca
- **2018** –RTOERO celebrated its 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary
- **2019** –RTOERO became Canada wide with 51 Districts, including BC, the Prairies, Quebec & the Atlantic
- 2021 District Facebook page initiated
- 2022 –District 13 celebrates 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary with 3917 members, and a new website page; RTOERO has a membership of 81,945

# **A Retirement Achievement!**

At midnight last June 30<sup>th</sup>, five RTOERO members in the Hamilton area completed their 35<sup>th</sup> year of retirement. These notable achievers are **Frank Farley** (90), **Jim Hewitt** (92), **John Nagy** (104), **Bill Russell** (91), and **Don Ward** (92). Equally notable is the fact that all five attended the Hamilton Normal School (Teachers' College) together in 1950, began their teaching careers simultaneously with the Hamilton Board of Education in 1951, retired 35 years later June 1986 at the Hamilton Convention Centre, and are now in their 36<sup>th</sup> year of retirement relatively mobile, verbal, and vertical!



That retirement reception was a memorable event because of the way in which it ended. Usually the evenina consisted of dignitaries and retirees piped to the stage by a followed bagpiper, bv greetings, speeches of well-wishing and salutes. souvenir gifts distributed to the retiring staff, and concluding with a formal response from one of the retirees. On this occasion, however, after formalities concluded, Frank Farley

sang a song: his version of Frank Sinatra's "My Way!" The applause when he finished was deafening. Reading our Frank's words, one can see why!

## **RTOERO Community Grants Program**

Thirty-one community projects are getting a boost thanks to funding from RTOERO's annual Community Grants.

In each RTOERO District, members take on many volunteer and advocacy roles. Members may apply through their Districts for Community Grants that support crucial local programs and services.

This year's Community Grants total \$79,885, for projects ranging from social isolation to environmental protection.

A committee of RTOERO members assesses the merits of each Community Grant submission. Since the inception of the Community Grants 21 years ago, RTOERO has donated \$1.85 million to more than 525 programs and projects.

## More than 2000 attend Vibrant Voices 2021 Webinar Series

As part of our Vibrant Voices program in 2021, we hosted a series of six webinars for members and interested stakeholders about our advocacy issues. More than 2,000 people attended the sessions, with an opportunity to hear from Canadian experts on the topics of geriatric health care, seniors strategy and environmental stewardship.

## Political Advocacy Committee (PAC) Report

The District 13 PAC has been actively working to promote and spread the message of RTOERO advocacy issues to politicians at all levels, as well as the wider community.

Our District 13 focus has been on health care for seniors;

- promote Pharmacare
- increase the # of geriatricians
- extend health services
- improve Long Term Health Care
- increase Home care
- act against elder abuse

In the fall, we spoke to several Members of Parliament about senior issues, to present many of the concerns of the District Political Advocacy Committee team members. They listened and asked pertinent questions. They did not know there are 81,000-plus RTOERO members. Now they do, and they were reminded that we are all voters!

**Pharmacare** - RTOERO is the largest national provider of non-profit group health benefits for education community retirees. Pharmacare is of prime importance to our 81,000-plus members, and to Canadians of all ages and stages.

Government Pharmacare policies need to be created and put in action. Politicians have been talking about the program but we need to know how they will implement it to ensure seniors can access the medicines that are essential for their wellbeing and to reduce hospitalizations. Ontario does offer some drug coverage like the Ontario Drug Benefit but all medications are not covered. No one should have to choose between purchasing the necessities of everyday life or medical prescriptions. Canada is the only country in the world that has universal health care but does not provide universal drug coverage.

**Environment** - Not just an election issue – it's our survival!

Vast wildfires, extensive flooding, extreme weather, unsafe water, biodiversity loss, and pollution can be intimidating concepts. While the harm is daunting, progress is possible.

That's why the environment is one of the core advocacy issues for RTOERO. We will be focusing on environmentallysustainable transportation, recycling and plastics diversion from landfills, and having a safe water supply for all Canadians.


A sustainable future depends on responsible use of resources, conservation and protecting our air, land and water. Individuals, companies and industry groups all have a part to play in environmental stewardship, and so does government. It needs to be accountable to us, our children and our grandchildren.

**Financial Security** - Statistics Canada estimates that 600,000 Canadian seniors are living in poverty. The number of people in the Ontario aged 65 and over is projected to rise from 2.6 million in 2020 to 4.5 million by 2046. Government policies need to do more to build and protect pensions.
